Principal's News

Welcome to Term 4 and our Week 1 Newsletter.

Term 4 traditionally is a busy term, and this year there is no exception. This term we focus heavily on ensuring learning goals are met as well as celebrating success and preparing all students in all year levels for transitioning to a new year level or school (year 6'ers). It's important that our communication is concise and timely for families to ensure all our students participate in the school's programming fully.

Summer Uniform Reminders

At Beechworth Primary School, we believe that a uniform promotes a sense of belonging, equality and school pride. The uniform has been designed to take account of comfort, flexibility, ease of care and cost. The basic colours are bottle green, yellow and black. As determined by School Council, it is expected that full school uniform will be worn by all students each school day.

Our Summer uniform includes:

- BPS Bottle-green polo shirt with yellow trim and school logo
- Black school shorts or skort of a reasonable length (not short running or sporting shorts, or bike shorts)
- Broad-brimmed BPS bottle-green hat
- White, black or grey socks
- Closed in school shoes or runners (black recommended)

Pokemon Card Trading

Pokemon card trading at school has been quite problematic with students struggling to understand that a trade is permanent. For this reason, we do not permit students in Foundation to Year 2 to trade Pokemon at school. Over the past Term we have had supervised trading during eating time inside the BER on Fridays for students in Years 3-6. However, we have seen a rise in issues of students who become upset later on during class time when they reflect on their trade. Teachers will speak to all students in year 3 - 6 today about trading fairly and the consequence of a trade.

Student, Classroom Placement for 2023

Parents who wish to make specific requests regarding classroom placement for their child in 2023, are required to send their request in writing by Friday 28th October. These can be delivered to the office or emailed to Sue on: susan.mcdonald2@education.vic.gov.au.

There are three types of parent requests the school will consider when using parent input into the process.

- 1. Parents can request a separation. Valid reasons why their child would not learn to the best of their abilities if in the same classroom as a particular student.
- 2. Parents can request a pairing. This requires both sets of parents to put in writing a request for their children to be in the same classroom.
- 3. Parents can request a type of teaching style. This requires a description of the attributes their child learns best with, parents are unable to request a particular teacher (by name).

Please note:

- That teachers have not been allocated to 2023 classes and this will not happen until very late in the vear.
- We do not refer back to requests from prior years as the relationships between children change
 over time. We will do our best to accommodate requests, but we cannot guarantee that they can be
 met should this be the case you will be contacted.

To ensure all families have clarity around the class placement process, the following is an outline of the initiatives Beechworth PS undertakes to ensure our classrooms are balanced and true places of learning.

Classroom configurations of student groupings is a balanced and educationally sound configuration based on: gender balance, academic balance, additional needs balance and an even distribution of numbers across year level classrooms.

Students have a voice regarding their placement by nominating five (5) learning partners which they rank from 1 to 5.

The principal and whole teaching team then reviews the lists vigorously to ensure classrooms are successfully configured. This takes into account prior knowledge and experience in acute cases.


