This Week's SWPBS Focus - CARING


At Beechworth Primary School we strive towards caring for ourselves, others and our environment. We are a caring school community that displays kindness and understanding to others through our words and actions.
















Student, Classroom Placement for 2023

Parents who wish to make specific requests regarding classroom placement for their child in 2023, are required to send their request in writing by Friday 28th October. These can be delivered to the office or emailed to Sue on: susan.mcdonald2@education.vic.gov.au.

There are three types of parent requests the school will consider when using parent input into the process.

- 1. Parents can request a separation. Valid reasons why their child would not learn to the best of their abilities if in the same classroom as a particular student.
- 2. Parents can request a pairing. This requires both sets of parents to put in writing a request for their children to be in the same classroom.
- 3. Parents can request a type of teaching style. This requires a description of the attributes their child learns best with, parents are unable to request a particular teacher (by name).

Please note:

- That teachers have not been allocated to 2023 classes and this will not happen until very late in the year.
- We do not refer back to requests from prior years as the relationships between children change over time. We will do our best to accommodate requests, but we cannot guarantee that they can be met should this be the case you will be contacted.

To ensure all families have clarity around the class placement process, the following is an outline of the initiatives Beechworth PS undertakes to ensure our classrooms are balanced and true places of learning.

Classroom configurations of student groupings is a balanced and educationally sound configuration based on: gender balance, academic balance, additional needs balance and an even distribution of numbers across year level classrooms.

Students have a voice regarding their placement by nominating five (5) learning partners which they rank from 1 to 5.

The principal and whole teaching team then reviews the lists vigorously to ensure classrooms are successfully configured. This takes into account prior knowledge and experience in acute cases.


