First stop was Holbrook, followed by a quick second stop at Gundagai. Students in Grade 5/6A have been listening to a new class novel 'River of Dreams' by Anita Heiss. It's a story based on true facts from the great flood of 1852 in Gundagai; where many people lost their lives. The sculpture is of two indigenous men, Yarri and Jacky Jacky who used their bark canoe to save people from their roofs and tree-tops. Such a great connection to their novel.

After arriving in Canberra the students visited the Australian War Memorial which was very insightful. The students were all very respectful and reflective. Then off to the Arboretum, which was beautiful. Whilst there they got to have a play on the 'Pod Playground'. A visit to the Dinosaur Museum after dinner finished off a jampacked day.

Day 2 commenced with a visit to Mount Ainslie Lookout. Then a visit to the Education Electoral Centre. It was very informative and interactive. We learnt heaps about voting in Australia. The afternoon saw a visit to Parliament House, where we had a visit from Helen Haines and then had a turn at passing a bill ourselves in The House of Representatives. A swim after dinner was a perfect end to the day.

Today a trip to the Australian Institute of Sport before heading back home to Beechworth.


