Welcome to our week 9 newsletter.



Temporary School Office

Road Safety

Keeping our students, families and staff safe is a high priority here at BPS. This includes coming to and from school. There are a few simple things we can do to assist this at these very busy times:

- Ensure we are parking legally, not parallel parking behind the parked cars in the provided parking spaces.
- Using the school crossings at both sides of the school to cross the roads.
- Making sure that we Stop and look before crossing the road and remember "walk, don't run."





STEM News

This week in STEM the 3/4 classes conducted an experiment which replicated the bursting of a seed pod. Throughout the term we have been looking at plant pollination, pollinators and plant reproduction. One of the things we learnt about was the different mechanisms plants use to get their seeds out into the environment. We learnt about mechanisms such as attachment (sticking to animals), water, wind, digestion (animals eating the fruit and then dispersing) and bursting.



For our experiment we used a balloon and bird seed to represent the fruit or pod which bursts open. The students then popped the balloon and measured how far the seed travelled. We found that the seed was able to travel up to 4m from where the balloon was popped.

The students are learning the basics of following an experiment procedure and reporting back with their findings.



Next week, for our last week of Term, all the classes will be engaging in a STEM engineering challenge.

Kind Regards, Sue McDonald Principal Students from our school have recently undertaken an education tour of the national capital. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$30 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.
