Principal's News

Welcome to our week 7 Newsletter.

Space Science Centre - Water Rockets

Wow Miss Nic, thank you so much for organising our Water Rockets STEM incursion (Gr3-6). Even the wet weather could not dampen the enthusiasm of the students as we engaged in this activity!

The students spent the first hour looking at the science of propulsion and building their rockets. They then took their rockets out to the oval and used water and pumps to charge their rockets before launching them across the oval. There were some spectacular results!

Over the past few weeks we have enjoyed having Lachie here working with our PE teacher Beth Mackie (Mrs B) running soccer clinics.


The students have really enjoyed building their soccer skills and developing a better understanding of how to work together as a team.

Capital Works Updates

On Wednesday we had our Capital Works meeting. This was a great meeting and we received updates on the progress and next steps. There will be a couple of things that will impact the movement around the school over the remainder of the term:

- <u>Bike Shed</u>: the bike shed and the area around the bike shed, including the rear gate entrance will be closed. The builders need to clean out and concrete the Queens Park side of the Bike Shed and will level the concrete at the end of the shed eliminating trip hazards. This will mean that we have nowhere to store bikes until next term.
- <u>BER Main Double Door Entrance</u>: commencing Tuesday, the entrance will be closed and blocked off whilst they continue to construct the walkway cover, connecting the current new walkway to the BER. Access to the BER will be via the door at the front between the new works and the original building.







It was great to be able to have a walk through the site and check out the progress. Plaster is going up and cabinetry is going into the STEM/Art room and the library. We are looking at a completion date of end of August.

VSSEC Visit

This week we were lucky to have our visit from the Victorian Space Science Education Centre (VSSEC). VSSEC is part of the Victorian Education Department. They are based in Melbourne but run outreach programs in regional Victoria. The aim of VSSEC is to "engage and inspire students in scientific learning and literacy. It encourages them to participate actively in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics, leading them towards an enriched life and career".




Our 3-6 students absolutely loved this incursion. Several students even said it was the "best-ever" incursion. The students spent the first hour of the incursion learning about aerodynamics and rocket design. They then worked with a partner to create their own rocket. The second hour was spent launching the rockets on the oval. It was amazing to see how far the rockets travelled, with many making it from the Fairy Tree end of the oval to the cricket pitch and beyond. One rocket even made it to the fence on the High Street end of the oval.

VSSEC has given us 3 of the launchers which will enable us to run another session like this ourselves. We hope to have VSSEC return later in the year to run a different program with the students.




Students presented their speeches to the Beechworth Lions Junior Public Speaking competition today.


