Principal's News

Welcome to our week 8 Newsletter.

Over the past weeks staff and students have been busy preparing and writing school reports. We are excited to be sharing these with our families on Thursday.

Last day for Term 2 – Friday 23 June. 2.30pm finish.

First day for Term 3 – Monday 10 July.

Racism - Call it out.

Over the past few weeks there has been an increasing incidence of racist words being used in our playgrounds. It has come to light that some students are using words towards others in a jocular friendly way without understanding the words they are using or the impact that they have on others. At other times these words are being used in a deliberate way to hurt. Neither of these situations are acceptable in any way.

Beechworth Primary School is a Respectful Relationships school. A whole of school approach to respectful relationships education not only provides in-class education, but addresses our school's culture, policies and procedures. Given the nature of the recent language in the yard, I decided that it was important to have a direct and explicit session with each class in the senior school (Year 3-6). We discussed Racism, using a BTN video as an outside voice to explain the situation. At the core of the message "It stops with me, what you say matters".

3 clear points were discussed with the students:

- Racist language is illegal.
- We do not use racist or derogatory language at this school.
- We call out inappropriate language.

Following this discussion all students were made aware of the actions and steps in response to Racist Language (even if it is said to a peer in fun, it is offensive to others who hear it):

- **First instance**: Student is removed from play/activity for the remainder of the time. Should it occur at the end of play then they need to sit out for the next play time. Use this time to reiterate the message that it is unacceptable and the next time will result in PBP.
- **Second instance**: Students will be placed in Positive Behaviour Program for the 5 sessions, where they will work with me on Racism. Obviously at this point parents are notified.
- Third and subsequent instances: On the third occasion they will be suspended.

Lion's Junior Public Speaking Competition

Last Friday, our Year 3 to 6 students engaged in the Lions Junior Public Speaking Competition.

They commenced their work through the preparation of individual speeches during their literacy block. Each student then presented a short speech to their class and some students elected to enter the competition and present their speeches. On Friday our Lions Club panel (Iris Mannik, John Eldridge, Christine Luckman and Jane Nicholas) listened to each of the speeches and selected our BPS representatives.

Congratulations to Isla, Lily, Heidi and Olivia who will now go on to represent BPS at the local competition at the end of July.



School Council Meeting Wed 14 June

Our BPS School Council met on Wednesday this week. During this meeting we:

- Participated in our annual ChildSafe training for School Council. This was followed by a review of where we are with our ChildSafe Policies and procedures, identifying those which are due for updating in 2023.
- Had a sneaky torchlight tour of the current progress of the Capital Works, followed by discussions on our timelines. We have an anticipated completion date of end of August.
- Discussed the functions of the OSHC Sub-committee in support of the School Council role of governance. Noting that as we have a third-party provider that the legal and financial aspects of our OSHC program lies with TheirCare.

Congratulations to Hazel, Karima and Violet for an amazing effort today representing our school at the Regional Cross Country in Benalla. Compost Bins have arrived at Beechworth Primary!



We are very excited to let families know that we now have compost bins at B.P.S. The Student Representative Council (SRC) group were keen to use some of their fundraising money on a sustainability project. Composting seemed like a simple but effective project that we could take on, in order to lessen our environmental impact. Previously, food scraps were all going into the bin and subsequently into landfill. As many of you would be aware, the breakdown of organic material in landfill results in greenhouse gases being generated. Each day there is quite a lot of food waste produced throughout the school. We now have a compost bucket in each classroom. A group of students remove the food waste to the compost bins each day.

Once the gardens are finished and the waste has broken down we will be able to use the compost on the gardens around school.




